INFRASTRUCTURE AND TRANSPORT 2

1. Address parking and traffic congestion issues, particularly around the Co-op and school – support for parking restrictions in busy locations.

Liaise with owners regarding parking at rear of Co-op.

- * Can the shipping containers go?
- * Can spaces be marked out to improve usage?

Parking. Use old school site providing off road parking and charge small amount per ½ hour.

Ask school to address issue.

Encourage parents to walk to the School with their children.

10 minute walk to school policy.

Parking restrictions outside school and along High Street.

Move school to alternative site.

Cycle stands outside Co-op.

School moved to a larger site and increase capacity. Utilise old school space for further retail / car parking. Move crossing to centre opposite Co-op. 20 MPH speed limit partially pedestrianised. Old school field for Bowling / Croquet / Children's play area.

Car sharing points with electrical charging points.

Use yellow lines to prevent parking in areas of congestion e.g. School / Shop, High Street and Huntersfield.

Promote a health / walk to school campaign with school.

To increase use of parking at side of Co-op put an access door in the side of the building.

Encourage Co-op to tidy up – sort out area behind shop.

Move school to a new location. Objectively set out the pros and cons of such a proposal so that the full advantages to the village can be appreciated.

Villagers comments added 26/27/9/2014:

Parking outside Co-op and school is very difficult when inconsiderate parents double park causing congestion and frustration.

The Co-op car park should never have been sold for housing the parking would not have been an issue.

Could Challow Station be open again freeing some of the congestion on the roads?

Stop cars being parked on pavements

Getting out of Sheard's Lane is a big problem as lack of vision up and down the road.

Clear rear of Co-op and mark out parking spaces. Use yellow lines to restrict High Street parking

Its dangerous for little children to cross there

Safety issues must be addressed throughout the village – parking and correct use of pavements – more warning signs and/or effective policing

No parking should be allowed outside the school on the High Street

Cycle stands and dog clips outside the Co-Op

Parking is an issue

Clear rear of Co-Op and mark out parking

Use yellow lines to restrict High Street parking

2. Address speed of traffic, particularly within the village – support for traffic calming and/or 20mph speed restriction within village.

Speeding. Restriction of 20 MPH in High Street and outside school

20 mph speed limit by school, Co-op and around bends.

20 mile limit in village, YES or NO.

Allowing parking on High Street restrict speed. Traffic calming bumps etc. not effective.

Remove white lines in High Street and Chapel Road.

"Shared space" outside School and Co-op.

Traffic calming in High Street, Chapel Road and Bow Road

Increase use of plants and / or large tubs / planters (where possible) to enhance visual appeal of village and slow traffic along wider / open stretches of road.

20 MPH restriction for centre of village – area by shop / school.

Identify sites for Vehicle Actuated Signs, seek OCC approval and either grant or S106 funding to deliver

Push for 20 MPH along High Street especially by Co-op and school.

Make High Street pedestrian – close it to traffic.

Villagers comments added 26/27/9/2014:

Speed restrictions needed, especially where the pedestrians cross.

Need traffic calming on A417 when new houses completed

What about the congestion caused by so many extra vehicles, especially when emergency vehicles try to get through.

There are very few people who do not speed through the village. Fine those who do.

20 mph / one way system by the school. It is lethal at present.

20 mph speed limit through village needed

Traffic calming in High Street and 20mph through estates

20mph speed limit for area next to school/shop

Traffic zooms by – someone could get knocked over

20mph speed restriction

Might use bus more if later service allowed visits to theatre/concerts or from Didcot (rail) for visits to London

Address speeding traffic and drivers using Horsecroft/High Street to do U turns

20mph speed restriction

Need traffic calming on A417 when new houses completed

20mph speed limit through village

Real danger of village becoming rat-run with the current streets too narrow to accommodate cars

Cars go too fast down High Street/Chapel Road

3. Improved bus services and access to public transport – particularly more frequent and later services to Wantage and Faringdon and more direct services to places of work/education i.e. Oxford, Swindon, Didcot.

Hold talks with bus companies for improved schedule for SITV.

Bus service to meet buses Faringdon and Oxford to Oxford and Didcot / Harwell to reach both for 8.30 - 9 a.m. and back 5.30 - 6.00 and 7 p.m. This could cover school and after school clubs.

Public Transport. Needs improving but not our remit.

More bus shelters, YES or NO where?

With increasing population bus companies to be lobbied to increase services.

Improved frequency of Bus Route 67 – hourly at least.

Extend peak journeys to Didcot/Abingdon.

Transport to allow people to commute and attend college.

Suggest Bus runs are routed Wantage / Faringdon later to link with Oxford / Swindon. Maybe a circular route via Oxford / Abingdon / Wantage / Faringdon / Oxford would work.

Bus service will only improve if people use it. No point running village bus on days / routes when service busses run.

A station at Grove with a shuttle bus from village would address many accessibility issues. This could be a Vale infrastructure requirement.

 $Less\ transport\ for\ schools-need\ to\ either\ encourage\ more\ busses\ for\ schools\ /\ or\ Faringdon\ /\ Wantage\ school\ to\ provide\ transport.$

Write to bus companies to improve bus service – more frequent.

Villagers comments added 26/27/9/2014:

Improve transport frequency and timings

Need routine bus service to and from Wantage and Faringdon

Better public transport links for SITV needed

Bike lane needed to Faringdon and Wantage

Improved direct bus service to allow students/workers to access local towns for education/employment

Improve bus service to Oxford as well as Faringdon/Wantage

Improve bus service to Faringdon/Wantage but mostly a regular service to Swindon/Oxford

Direct bus service to Oxford for workers and others

Its almost impossible for non car drivers to get to Oxford or Swindon as the route does not include SIV

Evening bus to/from Wantage would be useful

Better public transport links

New station at Grove

4. Larger capacity school

If not possible to extend on site – will need a new school – two entry so 450+ - will not then be a village school.

Liaise with Vale to ensure they are aware of where these improvements are wanted

<u>Larger School</u>. On QEII field. Get council to clean it up as they did in Banbury, OCC own the land!!

If we get 400+ new homes where does the school go?

School to cater for all village children now and in the future, by whatever means but hopefully in its traditional site.

Look at 2 alternatives if where is – school to address parking and congestion walking crocodiles.

Ex county to told of NP ideas.

2nd floor for school and increase car park.

Move school to alternative sight e.g. QEII field.

Limit capacity of school in order to limit expansion of village.

Explore mixed use of Millennium Green (i.e. for sport or play) and consider expansion onto hard standing playground

Do need a larger school – awaiting OCC feasibility study to see if possibilities to extend on site – 1 extra class now.

If and when school is extended, build a car park for dropping off and picking up.

Villagers comments added 26/27/9/2014:

Do agree larger school will be needed but think we should retain the school we have got

New school to cater for all the children

The village will die if only 'non-children' houses. Why would families move here if no places for the children?

Against any changes to current school

New school on QE2 field –no more retro fittings, our pupils should have the best

If more houses where are the children going to school?

The facilities and resources at our present school are better than most new built schools – I have been in- expand on current site if possible.

New school on new site

Current school has very convenient site. Could this be expanded on the same site to accommodate more children? This would be much cheaper than a whole new school

New school on a new site may be a new community asset. Develop old school site for more retail offices.

Larger school must be catered for – either on the possible new site or by using the memorial field for out of school kids

Increased size new school

Need school with more capacity – too many families moving to the village cannot send their children To the village school – why move here?

If more people then we need a better or another school it would create employment opportunities

Stop parents parking outside the school

Relocate school

New school on new site

Current school has convenient local location – could this be expanded on the same site to accommodate more children? This would be much cheaper than building a whole new school – perhaps money could be spent elsewhere?

New school – new site a new community asset. Develop old school site for more retail/offices etc

The village will die if only non-children households move here. Why would families move here if no places at the school?

New school to cater for the children and also new housing estates

Do think we need more space but should retain the school we have

5. Improved broadband capacity for homes and businesses.

Broadband. Outside our control.

It's coming anyway.

Broadband is coming!

Village wide Superfast Broadband Wi-Fi network

Villagers comments added 26/27/9/2014:

Improve Broadband

Better Broadband/WiFi

Broadband is a must - involvement at exchange

Broadband is too slow

6. <u>Improved street lighting in the village.</u>

<u>Street Lighting</u>. Ensure all new street lighting on timers – long off. At midnight so we can sleep or enjoy dark skies.

More street lights YES or NO where?

Leave improved lights out of the village. We cope as is.

Beware light pollution

Better lighting on High Street, Chapel Road and Cottage Road.

Care should be taken in the sighting of any new street lights to preserve "Dark Sky" concepts for our Astronomers.

Lighting at pavement level, lighting the way, not contributing to light pollution, Dark Skies!

Street lighting to be on timers and be directed down to create Dark Skies.

Street lighting improved with possible traffic calming or other restrictions.

Need more street lighting down High Street especially opposite the Anchor.

Villagers comments added 26/27/9/2014:

Needs to be improved

Better lighting at pavement level needed

No more street lighting, particularly in the conservation area. Character would be ruined.

I disagree – the dark and night skies are a rare privilege. No new lighting please

We do not need to improve standard street lighting

Street lighting should be better

If more street lighting will ruin the night sky (like Swindon) – you want to see the stars

From VH to Joyce's road down the alleyway its too dark to the 1st street light

Be careful with locating improved street lighting – only use where necessary – preserve something of the night sky and also general environmental input

7. Improved drainage and sewerage – reduce flooding.

Lobby VWHDC/OCC to clear culverts around village regularly.

Drains/Sewers. Try to make improvements conditional BEFORE development starts.

Increase drainage capacity on Faringdon Road. Improve storm drainage. Increase capacity of treatment works – Hello Thames Water.

Improved road drains regularly cleaned so they work. Improved drainage ditches.

Improved drainage by increasing capacity of sewage works and attached infrastructure.

Improve ditch clearance and river clearance and flooding will decrease.

Engage Thames Water via N.P. – ask them to commit to deliver these through / in conjunction with new development and agree high level plan.

Water authority to be told at Application stage of development 150cm pipes are not big enough.

Villagers comments added 26/27/9/2014:

Flooding does not need to be a problem in SIV

Improve ditches and road drains

OCC to service culverts/drains/streams

New larger sewer down Faringdon Road to Treatment Works

Treatment Works at Capacity

Sewers overflow already. Need overhaul of present drainage as a stipulation of more housing

Sewage problems need to be addressed

8. Mains gas available throughout the village.

Gas. Outside our control.

Cost of laying pipework for mains gas throughout the village should be sought from section 106 money.

Extend gas mains to rest of village. R. T who pays?

Mains gas should be available to anyone who needs / wants it at a fair price.

Gas if paid for by developers.

9. Improved water pressure.

Water pressure and power supply are real issues

Improve water pressure

10. Pedestrian crossing on A417.

<u>Pedestrian crossing on A417</u>. At least one near Jockey and another at new roundabout at junction with Cottage Road and A417.

Pelican X a minimum. Footbridge ideal.

It's happening.

Crossing will be somewhere between roundabout and Horse and Jockey. OCC meeting to discuss end of August.

Pedestrian crossing on A417 not opposite pub but near new development

Villagers comments added 26/27/9/2014:

Will need a crossing with new houses and Horse and Jockey

On David Wilson's homes plan – certainly necessary.

New roundabout on A417 with Cottage Road

If this does not happen then pedestrians are at risk

New roundabout on A417 at end of Cottage Road

11. Other comments

Central Solar panel farm to feed village.

SPORTING AND LEISURE FACILITIES 2

1.Footpaths with access for those of limited mobility – including support for cicular footpath around village

A great idea as long as all contaminated sites have been cleaned

Hard surface to allow use by wheelchairs/buggies

Safe for children to walk to sporting and leisure activities

Identify footpath around village and show gaps where they occur to encourage landowners to make sections of land available.

2. Football pitches

Only on 'cleaned sites' – one large or two junior pitches (junior pitches at the school?

To be used with football club

Fundraise for sporting activities - Football Association/LTA/NBA/Lottery/Landfill Tax Trusts etc/

More pitches on QEII field

Opportunity for much provision following decontamination of rubbish tip and sensible location of school

Villagers comments added 26/27/9/2014:

Football club is part of the village heritage - good for future generations - keep social and playing sides Possibly develop football field - new one opposite on other side of A417 - could be football/cricket pitch? Retain existing football field and facilities additional sports clubs should be driven by their support in the last

10/20 years 6 local cricket teams (within 5 mile radius) have folded

Only on clean sites – one large or two junior football pitches (junior pitches at the school?) to be used with football club

Separate to cycling/walking trail maybe around ponds nature reserve of new builds

Village based then can be used in the winter using existing lighting and shelter of existing buildings/hedges

13. Adventure trail

Needs to be close to houses for safety could run round edge of existing open spaces

Old School site or QEII field

14. Skateboarding/BMX park

Bigger – same size – remove?

Graffiti wall has been a great success in reducing the amount of graffiti round village

Relocate to QEII field use proceeds from sale of existing field
